Museum & Heritage Sites
 Todd's Shoe Repair, Badger Creek Museum, Mount Prospect School, the MTS building and Mather Post Office make up the Heritage Village in Cartwright's Centennial Park.

The Blacksmith Shop is a working museum, open during Ponderosa Days, August long weekend, and by appointment. In Mather, stop to see "The Rock" and the memorial wall which commemorate the 100th anniversary of the settlement. A cairn at the crossing of No. 5 highway and Badger Creek commemorates the trek of the Boundary Commission in 1873 and the NWMP in 1874.

Cartwright is a quiet, friendly village of 350 people, six miles from the U. S. border. The town was first established in the 1880's along the Boundary Commission/NWMP Trail at Badger Creek. Named after Sir Richard Cartwright, an early member of parliament who owned land in the area, the town moved to its present location in 1885. The Rural Municipality of Roblin includes the village district of Mather, six miles east of Cartwright. The area is primarily agriculture, mixed grain and livestock, with several small industries also providing employment.



Historic Anglican and Luthern Churches in Cartwright, which also has a Church of God in Christ (Mennonite) church. Mather is home to Trinity Mennonite Fellowship and St. Andrews United Church.



Rock Lake Beach

The picturesque southwest shore of Rock Lake, 9 miles north of Cartwright, boasts great fishing (and ice fishing), boating and water sports, camping and day use areas with a store open year-round. All kinds of wildlife, particularly many types of waterfowl and birds, abound in the area.



Community Services

Cartwright and Mather are served by the Roblin/Cartwright Volunteer Fire Department and Ambulance Service, a personal care home and doctor's clinic, plus handi-van and other senior's services. Emergency medical services are provided at Tri Lake Health Center, 20 miles west. Cartwright and Mather are in the Turtle Mountain RCMP Detachment area. Cartwright has a branch of the Lakeland Regional Library, with public internet use available. Every child is important in our small Kindergarten to Senior 4 school. A nursery school operates two mornings per week.



Badger Creek Park just outside Cartwright provides swimming, picnicking and playground, just north of the ball park in Cartwright.
